Dear Graduate and Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

Can you believe it? Graduation is right around the corner...then it is off to the Project Grad celebration! For everyone's safety and enjoyment, we ask that the following rules, guidelines, and schedules be observed.

WHO CAN ATTEND?

Project Graduation is open to all graduating students of Leilehua High School Class of 2012 who have registered and paid. If you find that you are not graduating and have already registered and paid, we would like to encourage you to join us anyway.

WHAT TO BRING

- Change of clothing, comfortable **jeans/long pants**. No shorts, Capri's or skirts.
- **Covered shoes**. No sandals or slippers.
- A **light jacket or sweater** is recommended. Students are responsible for this.
- A Ziploc plastic bag with necessary medication and/or personal items. Print or type an index card with the graduate's name, medication name, dosage and reason for the medication. Fill out the pink **Medication Authorization Form** in this packet and bring it with you on that night to check in. Acceptable items include prescription medication, aspirin/ non-aspirin tablets in **sealed packets**, proper measuring spoon for liquid medication, glasses or contact lenses. Medication requiring refrigeration will NOT be accepted. **It is recommended that the student take medication (antibiotics or other prescription medication) before checking in.**
- Leave all contraband items at home or with parent/guardian including: alcoholic beverages, drugs, chewing tobacco, cigarettes/lighters, pagers, cell phones, wallets/purses, backpacks, iPods, PDAs, cash, car/house keys, makeup, brushes/combs, pocket knives, jewelry, candy, and leis (edible seed, gum, kukui nut or other novelty-type of lei or haku.)

DRESS CODE

- No head gear (bandanas, caps, or hats).
- Graduates may wear **ONE** floral lei or floral haku for the evening. Student will be responsible for their lei or haku. **NO** candy, edible seed, gum, liquor, money, kukui nut or other novelty-type lei or haku will be allowed.
- **For safety reasons, graduates are asked to remove all jewelry and piercing(s) prior to Project Grad Night. If unable to remove the piercing(s), we will ask the student and parent(s)/guardian(s) to sign a waiver form to absolve Project Grad 2012 of any injury that might occur during the event. If the piercing(s) should injure any other student(s) and/or equipment - you will be liable!**
- *If a student is unable to remove piercing(s), then the student will not be allowed to participate in specific activities and will have a colored wristband stating that.*
- **Piercing(s), such as lip/nose rings, under garment piercing and industrial bars, will not be allowed for student's safety.**

WHAT NOT TO BRING

1. Jewelry
*(including watches and **any** piercings)*
2. Cell phones/pagers/PDAs
3. iPods/CD players/MP3 players
4. Purse/Wallet/Backpacks
5. Cash/Credit or Debit Cards
6. Car or House Keys
7. Cameras
8. Cigarettes/Lighters
9. Alcoholic Beverages
10. Chewing Tobacco
11. Contraband Drugs
(if the graduate has medication, a medication form must be filled out)
12. Belt Buckles *(large)*
13. Sunglasses
14. Make-Up
15. Brushes/Combs
16. Pocket Knives/Guns/or any Weapons
17. Candy/Gum
18. Explosive Devices
19. Additional Leis
(no money, candy, edible seeds, gum, liquor, kukui nut or other novelty-type lei or haku allowed)
